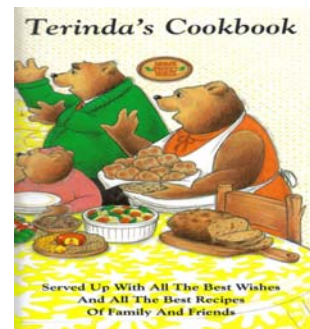

In June 2005, Terinda was diagnosed with a chronic kidney disease called juvenile nephronophthisis (degenerative disease of the kidneys). Since Terinda's diagnosis, they have made regular trips to the children's renal department at the Health Sciences Centre. They are currently doing a work-up for a kidney transplant. They will be required to spend a lengthy stay in Winnipeg. This cost is not covered by insurance or our Medicare system. Terinda's Aunt Cheryl Digby has compiled a cookbook of recipes from numerous friends and family dedicated to Terinda. All profit from the sale of Terinda's Cookbook will go to Barb and Terinda to assist with the costs associated with Terinda's kidney transplant.

## Inglis & District Community Club Grow Project Report - 2008

The Inglis and District Community Club was involved with another grow project in 2008. The grow project committee consisted of Luc Huberdeau, Kent Fingas, Dave Rowat, Ken Fingas and Lorne Frieze. This was the same 100 acre parcel that was used for the grow project in 07' which was rented from Wilfred and Rita Wildeman.

The field was fertilized last fall using NH3. Thanks goes out to Viterra for donating a portion of the product used in fall fertilization. The committee decided to grow wheat in 08' and was sown on May 16. Many thanks goes out to Mid-Sask Ag for donating delivery of the fertilizer to the field. A post seed/pre-emerge application for the pesky weeds was applied on May 24 by Robinson Custom Spraying which proved to be a smart decision as the year played out. Thanks to Dow Agro Sciences for donating the glyphosate used for this application. The next step was to apply an in-crop herbicide which was applied on June 17. Much appreciation goes out to Paterson Global Foods for their donation of some of the product used here. Then it was wait and see time till swathing rolled around which took place in mid-September. October 1st was the date in which the harvest took place and given the poor harvest weather this fall, it couldn't have turned out to be a better harvest day. The harvest crew consisted of Ken Fingas, Lorne Frieze, Garth Jackson, Bert Marshall and Brad Robin on the combines. Those doing the trucking to keep the grain away from the combines were Duane Zimmer and Kevin Fingas. Semi trailers were also parked in the field by Kent Fingas Trucking and Jacksons Seeds. Wilfred Wildeman rode shotgun in the grain truck and kept things in order at the bins. Dave Rowat fed the crew with a Bar-B-Q lunch in the field to top of the season.

The wheat crop ended up yielding a very impressive 58 bus/acre. A huge thank-you goes out to all the people involved through time, trucking, combining, picking stones, swathing, spraying, organizing and all of the other things that get done throughout the year to make this such a success.

**A huge thank-you goes out to Ken Fingas** for the NH3 application, the sowing, spraying, swathing and finally combining of the crop but most importantly for treating the crop like his own and making sure things got done when they needed to be. Thanks again Ken.

The IDCC apologizes for not being able to organize a community oriented harvest day for the 08' crop, but the weather was just not giving us that option this year.

The Grow Project Committee was not soliciting for donations near as hard in 08' as the IDCC is planning on doing this again in 09' and we will be pounding the pavement hard for donations then as this will be the final year of this project. This is a huge fund raising effort for the hall and skating rink and would like to encourage all to get involved next year in any way they can. Again, we would like to send a huge thank-you out to all involved and sincerely apologize if anyone was missed out.
