PARK WEST SCHOOL DIVISION RESTRUCTURING MEETINGS

The Park West School Division has experienced an enrolment decline of 480 students since 1998 and our projections show a further drop of 350-400 students in the next five years. This demographic change presents a significant challenge to remain fiscally viable and meet the existing and emerging needs of students. The Board of Trustees believes that a long term plan must be developed which matches our educational priorities with students needs, facilities, material and human resources. The Board of Trustees has scheduled meetings at all schools on different dates.

The meeting in Inglis will be held at the Inglis School Gym on Thursday June 14th from 7:00 - 10:00. All community members are welcome and encouraged to attend.

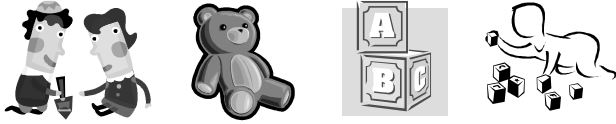
